

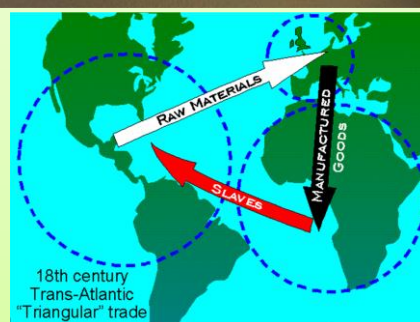

The Slave Trade and Liverpool



Sticky Knowledge

- 1190 - Liverpool known as 'lieurpul'
- 1207 - Liverpool founded by King John
- 1715 - Liverpool's first official dock built
- By 1792 Liverpool was firmly established as the leading slave port
- Between 1700 and 1807, ships from Liverpool carried about 1.5 million Africans across the Atlantic.
- The ports were used to import goods such as cotton, sugar, tea, cocoa from other parts of the world.
 - The city of Liverpool became very wealthy from the trade the ports provided.
 - The Albert Dock is named after Prince Albert. He opened the dock in 1846.
 - Some people such as William Roscoe campaigned for the abolition of slavery.
 - Some people opposed the abolition of slavery such as James Penny.
 - In May 1941, the Liverpool Blitz took place due to the significance of the docks.
